I couldn't afford weekly trips to the cinema, and I knew that my boys friends were up to all sorts! I had a Home-Start volunteer to support me with my youngest child who has autism. One day in passing, I told her what a rubbish mum I felt. She sat me down and together we drew up a plan of things that I could do across a whole week, so that I wasn't waking up each morning wracking my brains, coming up with activities for my boys. She helped me budget my money so that I knew that at least one day each week I could take my boys out. Swimming, the local farm park, a couple of fetes. The rest of the time, I would create things that I remembered were fun from my own childhood. Water fights in the garden, we built a go kart from some old pram wheels, face painting (using my old makeup!) and we went strawberry picking. I will never forget when September came, my boys turned to me and said they'd had the best summer ever. And that's when it dawned on me, it was all about creating happy memories, and money is not always needed for that."
